The policies should make clear which spaces are available to rent, what the rental rates are (for members or general public), and what the appropriate use is for each space? (Grounds and South building could be rented for events.) The policies should also make it clear what is considered a church group versus a church-affiliated group. Members may use building free for life events up to 4 times per year.

A Rental/building use checklist for entry and exit should be created detailing in what condition the space used should be left. All scheduled uses, rental or otherwise, of the building or grounds should be entered into the church events calendar in advance.

Ministers Report

September 8, 2021

This summer has been different for many reasons, not just that Covid's delta variant is raging across the country, but I've had to take some family leave, I had to leave last month and found that I had to take emergency leave this month. I used 20 hours. I appreciate the response of the church in letting me take that time. The time with my family was very important.

I preached twice, my first sermon, Expectations and the Broken Reality, delved into communication theory, focusing on the idea that what we hear is not what was said, that there is often considerable static in conversation. That video can be found here: https://youtu.be/VTDrdQ8PRsq?t=1356

My Second Sermon, Fear and Liberation, A Note on Breaking Expectations – explored fear and how fear can often get in the way of our relationships, but also why fear is also important toward our safety and even growth. I spent considerable time in the sermon exploring human evolution and the key it provides in understanding how we approach our fear. While in town because her law firm works on behalf of the Jackson Women's Clinic. She, a lifelong UU, likes to visit UU Churches while she visits.

During this month I also met with my mentor and multiple UU Ministers. \
